# **Proposed Changes to Articles of Association**

As discussed and approved by a resolution at the 2004 Annual Meeting, the Executive Committee participated in a strategic planning session at the National Association of Mutual Insurance Companies (NAMIC) offices on April 29, 2005. As approved by the resolution, ILCA paid NAMIC the amount of \$2500 to facilitate the session and to conduct an online survey of the membership in preparation for the planning session. The details of the survey and session will be shared with the membership at the 2005 Annual Meeting. New Vision and Mission Statements were developed along with several short and long term goals for the association. These new Statements are as follows:

Vision Statement: To achieve national recognition as the premier association for the loss control profession.

**Mission Statement:** To provide education and knowledge sharing opportunities that improve the loss control capabilities of members and to raise awareness of the benefits of professional loss control practices.

The main purpose of this planning session was to discuss the possibility of entering into a "fee for service agreement" or related agreement with NAMIC for "Association Management" services. As a result, NAMIC informed the Executive Committee that they would not be able to enter into any such agreement with ILCA and that they would no longer be able to participate as a Liaison or Member of the ILCA Executive Committee. NAMIC did state that they would continue to work in a cooperative manner with ILCA to promote the Association and the Loss Control Profession. As an affirmation of their support, NAMIC has offered \$2500 as a sponsor of the 2005 Annual Conference.

As a result of the planning session and NAMIC's new position regarding ILCA, the Executive Committee is proposing several amendments to Articles of Association. These changes are listed below. Article IX: Amendments, Section 9.1states that the Articles of Association may be changed at any regular meeting of the Association by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of a quorum of the membership, provided however that notice of the proposed changes have been published to the membership at least thirty (30) days prior to such regular meeting. Objections to any changes in these Articles may be filed in writing to the Association's Secretary, who shall state these objections to the meeting before any vote on them is taken. Objections may be mailed to: ILCA Secretary, PO BOX 38, Morton, IL 61550. Article VIII: Parliamentary Procedures, Section 8.1 states that a quorum for the transaction of business or the election of officers at any meeting of the Association shall be at least twenty (20) active members present at the meeting.

Amendments are listed below, any additional or new text is indicated by <u>underlined text</u>. Any text to be removed or stricken is indicated by <del>strikethrough text</del>.

# Articles of Association Amendment #2005-1:

Explanatory comments: As a result of the strategic planning session the Executive Committee is proposing the addition of a Student Membership grade. This additional membership grade is anticipated to spur interest in the Association at an early date for Full or Part Time students enrolled in a College or University and majoring in a Safety, Insurance, Risk Management or Related curriculum. Complete text of the amendment is listed below.

# Article III: Membership and Dues

- Section 3.1: There shall be (23) grades of membership as follows:
- Active Member Representatives of any insurance organization interested in furthering the prevention of loss in the property and casualty field. Requests for active membership of other related loss control representatives will be submitted to the Executive Committee of the Association for approval. Each active member shall have one vote in the Association.
- *Life Member* Members in good standing in the Association who have: (a) reached the age of retirement in their respective companies and (b) have had an active membership in the Association for at least (10) years, may have a life membership conferred upon them by a majority vote of the active members in attendance at a regular meeting of the Association. Life Members shall not be entitled to vote in the Association.
- Student Member Full or Part Time Students enrolled in a College or University and majoring in a Safety,Insurance, Risk Management or Related curriculum. Requests for student membership will be<br/>submitted to the Executive Committee of the Association for approval. The classification of<br/>Student Member can only be held for a maximum of 5 calendar years or until they have<br/>graduated. Upon notification of graduation, a student member will be advanced to the level of<br/>Active Member, the annual dues will be waived for the first calendar year as an Active<br/>Member. Student Members shall not be entitled to vote in the Association.

#### Articles of Association Amendment #2005-2:

Explanatory comments: As a result of the change in NAMIC's position regarding their involvement with ILCA, the Executive Committee is proposing that the Executive Committee representative from NAMIC be removed as a voting member of the Executive Committee. Related to this is the removal of the provision for the Liaison Committee to specifically coordinate with NAMIC and their Loss Control Committee, the revision allows for coordination and cooperation with any other supporting or allied organization.

# **Article VII: Committees**

- Section 7.1: *Executive Committee* The officers and, the immediate past president and one representative from the National Association of Mutual Insurance Companies shall constitute the Executive Committee. It is empowered to act in the name of the Association on all administrative and financial functions. All actions by this Committee shall be subject to review and approval by the membership at the regular meeting(s) of the Association. Four (4) Three (3) members of the Committee shall constitute a quorum.
- Section 7.4: *Liaison Committee* This Committee, which is appointed by the President, shall consist of not less than three (3) members of the Association, each of whom shall serve not less than one (1) year. They shall maintain contact and interchange information with The National Association of Mutual Insurance Companies, The Loss Control Committees, and any other supporting or allied organizations deemed necessary. The Liaison Committee shall report to the Executive Committee.

#### Articles of Association Amendment #2005-3:

Explanatory comments: As a result of the change in NAMIC's position regarding their involvement with ILCA, the Executive Committee is proposing that provision to assist NAMIC with publishing of the "Association Newsletter". Additionally, this amendment includes language to allow and authorize the Association under the direction of the Executive Committee to enter into a "fee for service agreement" for the purpose "Association Management" functions. This provision is critical to the growth and development of the Association, allowing an "Association Management Company" to perform day to day association business and event planning functions.

# Article X: Liaison and Control

- Section 10.1: The Association shall act as the programming organization for the Insurance Loss Control Association Conference under the direction of the Association' First Vice President.
- Section 10.2: The Registered Agent of the Corporation will be a member of the Insurance Loss Control Association and appointed by the Executive Committee when required.
- Section 10.3: The Association, under the direction of the <u>Executive Committee, may enter into "fee for</u> service agreements", "service contracts" or similar agreements for the purpose of "Association <u>Management" functions. "Association Management" functions may include, but are not</u> limited to: conference and event planning; conference and event administrative services; onsite conference and event coordination services; newsletter services; website and related internet technology services; and association of Mutual Insurance Companies or any other Such designee of the Executive Committee in publishing the "Association Newsletter." The Association will reimburse pay the National Association of Mutual Insurance Companies or any other such designee of the Executive Committee for any such services performed. the cost of compiling, laying out, publishing and distributing the newsletter to members of the Association.

# Articles of Association Amendment #2005-4:

Explanatory comments: This is the text to indicate the date of any revisions approved by the membership.

This constitutes a revision of the Articles of Association as constituted Aug. 1-2, 1932 and revised April 16-19,1951, Sept. 15-16,1958, April 3-4, 1962, April 3-5, 1967, February 28, 1972, April 13, 1973, April 23, 1979, April 14, 1981, July 20, 1982, October 16, 1984, October 22,1991, and October 21, 2003 and October 18, 2005.
